International Exchange Information

Exchange period	<p>From <u>February to July</u>.</p> <p>Courses are taught from February to the end of May.</p> <p>This period corresponds to the second semester of the Year 1 of the International Relations program.</p> <p>We recommend foreign students to arrive in Paris at least one week before classes begin at IRIS Sup'.</p> <p>Once in France, foreign students must visit IRIS Sup' International Office to register themselves.</p>
Academic system	<p>IRIS Sup' academic rating coefficient calculus system is based on the European Standard (i.e.: 1 IRIS Sup' rating coefficient equals 25 or 30 hours of work: classes and homework hours included).</p> <p>Equivalence of credits: IRIS Sup' rating coefficient of 1 (equivalent to 1 ECTS).</p> <p>Students must validate IRIS Sup' rating coefficient of 30 during the mobility: equivalent to 30 ECTS.</p> <p>IRIS can deliver ECTS credits (European Credits Transfer System).</p> <p>Our first-year-diploma is a foundation course a private degree (EQV bac +4) common to both our 2nd year degrees (EQV level 7) recognized by the French Ministry of Labor and registered at the <i>Répertoire national des certifications professionnelles</i> (RNCP).</p> <p>A transcript of records will be edited at the end of the mobility.</p>
Level of studies	The level of the courses is equivalent to a Master 1 (according to the Bologna system).

Application deadlines	The deadline for the submission of applications is 15 th of November.
Admission as an exchange student	<p>Documents to be submitted in ".pdf" format: 1 pdf per document.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A resume in English or French. - A cover letter in French. - An ID photo. - A copy of the applicant's passport: pages containing photo, personal data, passport number and expiration date. - A proof of knowledge of the French language. - A presentation letter from the home university addressed to Mrs Christine Aubrée, Head of School. - A copy of the student's last diploma. - An official transcript of records.
Language requirements	It is important for students to be acquainted with French language because most of the courses offered at IRIS Sup' are taught in French. We advise a minimum B2 level.
Documents students must provide before arrival	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Passport with a long-stay visa. - Health insurance or European Health Card. - Repatriation insurance. - Professional liability insurance. - Public liability insurance.
Visa information	<p>European Union students do not need to apply for a visa.</p> <p>Foreign students must have a long-stay visa for education (VLS-T or VLS-TS).</p>

	<p>For exchanges with more than 40 countries, students must enroll in “<i>Etudes en France</i>” website to prepare the visa application.</p> <p>List of countries and details: https://pastel.diplomatie.gouv.fr/etudesenfrance/dyn/public/authentification/login.html?codeLangue=EN </p>
Fees and expenses	<p>No academic fees are charged to our international students that come through a bilateral agreement. Expenses such as housing, meals, transportation, books, supplies, mandatory health insurance, and other such costs are the responsibility of the student.</p>
